Gender ambiguity in the new game Glitch

My current favorite video game is the new MMORPG, Glitch. What's interesting about this game is the gender-neutral approach it takes to player characters. Unlike games like World of Warcraft or even The Sims, where players' characters are obviously male or female, Glitch characters have no obvious gender markings -- no ridiculously large breasts or muscles. Instead, players can mix and match gender features to create their own unique look. Facial features, hair styles, and clothing options are available to any player; the only limitations are whether or not a player pays a subscription fee. The game even offers players the option of going completely without clothes or wearing black "censorship" bars. A player's real life gender is often masked by his or her Glitch's design, but my own character has female features since I used my real name for my Glitch. I've seen players with typical male names wear skirts and dresses, and I've seen players with typical female names wear masculine-style clothes. I think I may change my character's name some time in the future for something more generic, just to play around with the game's various gender options.
