- Have one group member raise his/her hand when you're ready to receive the Step 3: worksheet for Step 3. Complete the questions on the worksheet. Make sure each group member understands the corrections and can explain your responses.

6. Using an English dictionary, explain why the use of "avail" in line 29 is incorrect. Which word should have been used?

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Homework: Tiered Assignment

I would divide the class into groups based on my prior knowledge of their abilities. I would use either test scores from earlier in the semester or some other type of pre-assessment to create groups with three different levels. Instead of three large groups – one group per activity level – I would probably divide them into pairs or maybe three-person groups, but this would depend on the number of students in the class and how well they have worked in groups before. Once the class was organized into groups, I would give each student a copy of the essay, which includes the assignment's directions broken down into three steps.

The first step is to read the essay individually, making note of any errors. I might read the essay aloud before the students split into groups, but this would depend upon the class's behavior and my knowledge of how likely they are to immediately get to work once they are placed in groups. Students would then be allowed to work at their own (or their group's) pace to complete steps two and three of the assignment.

Step two is for the group members to discuss the essay before they even see the worksheet they are to complete in class. Students would be expected to discuss or even debate the most obvious and most serious errors. I would monitor each group to make sure they have actually discussed the essay for at least five minutes before handing them the worksheet, which is step three of the assignment. Since I would be the one passing out the worksheets, it would be less likely for the different groups to realize their worksheets are different because of their ability levels. If asked, I would tell them that the worksheets are different to help prevent cheating.

Step three is for students to complete a worksheet based on their academic ability. Each group has similar questions, but the questions are asked differently depending on the group's ability. For example, the lowest tier's assignments are easier, with a couple of multiple choice questions, whereas the highest tier's assignments are all open-ended questions. However, there is some overlap among the different groups' questions. Each group has the exact same question about the choice of the word "commune" in line two. They are expected to use an English dictionary to determine why "commune" is wrong. The goal is for all the groups to realize "communicate" is the best word choice, but I anticipate needing to guide the lower two groups more than the highest-level group to finding this answer.

After each group is finished, and depending on how much time is left in class, I would lead a classroom discussion about the essay. I would start with general observations about the essay, making sure to ask at least one (possibly two) students from each tier their thoughts on the original essay. I would then ask the questions from the worksheet, again trying to use generalizations rather than the exact questions since the groups' work was varied. Finally, I would tell the students that they should expect to see at least one more assignment from this essay. I would base the difficulty of the follow-up assignment on how well students did on the first assignment. Hopefully, students in the lowest tier would be able to move up to the middle tier, and students from the middle tier would advance to the highest tier.
